Dear Friends.

For Christians there is no season closer to our hearts than Lent and Easter. That is because it demonstrates to us how close God's heart is to us. As individuals, we will respond in our own way, but we have only one desire: to know our Savior more fully.

Here are some suggestions that may help you focus on Jesus:

- Read a Gospel or all four.
- Make an anonymous gift to someone.
- Refrain from something you like to do and make it an offering to God.
- Make yourself available to serve a member of your family (or a friend or another person). Do whatever that person wants without protest and don't tell why you are doing it.
- Affirm a scripture or sing a simple tune to yourself several times a day.
- Practice seeing the presence of God everywhere.
- Take a walk with the purpose of seeing God in the creation.
- When faced with a difficult situation, pray and wait for God to work first before you act.
- Be open to do what the Spirit is leading you to do.

On Sunday, April 1 (Easter, not April Fools!) we will gather at 7:00 am in the Memorial Garden at Trappe; 8:45 am at Faith Chapel and 11:00 am at Trappe; we will sing the resurrection song of our God who is Eternal Life!



LIBRARY NEWS by Charlotte Edwards

It's a New Year and a special time. We have almost a year in front of us until the next one. Time to set and get started on goals for the rest of the year. Whatever your goals are, there is a book to help in our library.

Be it weight loss, more exercise, improved dispositions, or better organization, the words are there for guidance and support. There are books on social problems, alcoholism, and ways to help with the raging drug epidemic. These are not exactly pager turners, but good, solid words of wisdom. We have a shelf of books to help with any goals for improved Christian living or facing general turnoil.

If your goal is to read the Bible more, there are two shelves of concordances and commentaries. They offer more explanations and broaden our understanding of the Bible. There are also several versions of the Bible for whatever your preference may be.

A memorable book for January reading is **Sink Reflections** by Marla Cilley—The Fly Lady. I have mentioned this book before and am re-reading it myself. One suggestion for getting in control is the chapter on decluttering. This time of year inspires us to get rid of the old, put away the new, and take care of all the tasks in between. The Fly Lady says to dispose of twenty-seven things a day until you can look around the house and feel satisfied. Then relax and read a book. The list can include items no longer needed that can be passed on (think "Martha's Closet"), tossed out, recycled, or put in their proper place and kept there. Items can also be paperwork to be dealt with and permanently sort out those piles setting here and there.

Another great suggestion is "fifteen minutes per room" until they are totally refreshed. Set a timer and see how much can be done in fifteen minutes. Six rooms in one and a half hours is doable before or after going out and about. You can still have the time to read and relax over coffee or at the end of the day.

Additions to the library for pleasure reading are *The Tearoom Mysteries*. This series of twelve books is published by Guideposts. You can be assured of a good story and good mystery "sprinkled generously with faith, family and friends."

AFTER CHURCH FELLOWSHIP

We need your help. To increase the fellowship of Christ's Body (the Church), a fellowship time was started a number of years ago. Refreshments are provided by volunteers after the 11:00 a.m. worship service on the Second Sunday of most months. (In May, that Sunday is Mother's Day, so we have Fellowship another Sunday in order that people can be with their mothers.) Lately roughly 20 people stay for Fellowship. Hopefully, this number will increase, and it has been suggested that new members be recognized on the second Sunday so there will be extra time to spend with them.

Here is where your help is needed: we need more people participating in overseeing Fellowship. Refreshments can be whatever you choose. In the past it has been as simple as donuts and coffee or as elaborate as three different kinds of soup, sweets, and a variety of drinks. Whoever volunteers gets to decide what to have and asks others to help. Others offer to help whoever volunteers. There is coffee and tea in Wesley Hall already, or you can do something else for drinks. If you are not comfortable with the kitchen, there are people who would be happy to team up with you and show you how to operate the coffee maker and find supplies. There never seems to be a shortage of folks willing to lend a hand with clean-up, but we generally try to keep dishes to a minimum. You will be helping to provide an opportunity to build the fellowship of the congregation and make newcomers feel welcome. Faith Chapel members are welcome to attend the Fellowship and take part in overseeing a Sunday! Please sign up for a Sunday on the chart in the back of the Sanctuary in Trappe.
