## **PASTOR'S PIECE**

I've been wondering for the past few days just how to start this article, as it is not an easy one to write. So, I decided to start with the words of Thomas S. McAnally, as found in the booklet: *Questions & Answers About The United Methodist Church*. In this booklet, McAnally, writes this about "itinerant" clergy or the "itineracy": "Historically, Methodism has had an 'itinerant' clergy, meaning that all clergypersons of the annual conference are subject to annual appointment by a bishop. **Being part of the itineracy means that a clergyperson is willing to go where sent. This system assures every pastor a church and every church a pastor. It also matches the gifts and graces of an individual with the needs of a particular church or area of service." (p. 24)**
