LIBRARY NEWS by Charlotte Edwards

Thanksgiving and Christmas are coming before we know it. Now is the time to get into some books that will help to focus on the true meaning of these holidays. They will be on the shelves soon.

A book that has been added to the library is **A Midnight Clear** by Katherine Patterson. It is a collection of short stories that are meaningful and quite varied. A traveling man picks up a hitchhiker who attempts to rob him. A lonely woman is befriended by a persevering boy. In Communist China, a female scholar and an old watchman bond and are secretly reading the Bible. A child copes with disappointment and a young couple await the birth of their baby. The stories were written for the author's husband to read from the pulpit. All the stories reflect "a vision of hope and peace," taking us back to the first Christmas. It sounds like a good read-aloud book for a family to share.

For good fiction, the last several books of the Tearoom Mysteries have been added. This series of books (most by different authors) is published by Guideposts. The blurb on the back of each book says: "Mix together one stately Victorian Home, a charming lakeside town in Maine and two adventurous cousins with a passion for tea and hospitality. Add a large scoop of intriguing mysteries, sprinkle generously with faith, family, and friends, and you have the recipe for the Teahouse Mysteries." Sounds like a good escape during a busy time.

Don't forget to peruse the shelves or the Little Free Library for a meaningful book to read and share for inspiration, education, or problem solving. Maybe you can line up some New Years reading to plan and support your resolutions.

NEW RAMP APPROVED

The Administrative Council/Trustees have approved the installation of a new ramp by the side of the church near the parking area. It will cost about \$10,000.
