

As the Christmas season arrives, we need to shop reasonably, prepare graciously, and remember the "Reason for the Season" in order to enjoy all our Christmas celebrations.

STAINED GLASS WINDOW REPAIRS AND NEW COVERINGS

The Church's stained glass windows tell the story of our Lord and represent the merger and unity of our oneness in Christ between Mt. Pleasant Methodist Church and Lebanon Methodist Church. Their artistic value is immeasurable and a treasure to all who experience them.

To enhance their beauty and protect them better from the weather, the October 16 meeting of the Administrative Council/ Trustees approved the repair of two of the stained glass windows and the addition of protective covers on the windows in the Sanctuary. The total cost is \$34,970.

The seed money has come from a couple who are not members but have been making regular contributions toward the care and preservation of the windows. Their contribution has now reached \$12,514. Other support will come from interested people and Memorial Funds.

This is a big project for our church. The Administrative Council/Trustees believe this is the time to act. This work will be Glory to our God!

- Did you notice? The front door and the two doors at the Sunday School entrance of the Trappe UM Church are looking great because of new paint. Many thanks to the skillful painter.
- One of the great treasures of the Trappe UM Church has always been the stained-glass windows. The Memorial
 Fund has a growing amount designated for the repair and maintenance of the windows. A motion was made and
 seconded to initiate the windows' repair and restoration. With the funds already given toward this in the Memorial
 Fund, and potentially from Building & Maintenance funds, along with potential donations from Church members and friends, it was decided unanimously that work on this project should begin.
- During the worship service on November 3, the Sunday School children will present a short program on one of their group of lessons this year.
- The Church Library will soon have their renovated Street Library back on Powell Avenue.
- Pastor Parish Relations Committee met and again emphasized appreciation for Rev. Moore's time with the Trappe/Bruceville Charge and hope for a continuing relationship with us.
- United Methodist Women (UMW) will meet this Sunday, Oct. 20, after the Worship Service.






Anniversaries and birthdays not available in the on-line edition
